INVESTIGATING FRACKING - THE HEALTH AND SOCIAL IMPACTS

As licences for large areas of the north of England have been licensed to gas companies for fracking, communities need to find out more about what this means. We have invited two speakers from Ryedale, the next “fracking frontline”, to speak about their experiences and answer your questions:

Dr Tim Thornton, a North Yorkshire GP for 30 years

Tim will talk about the basics of fracking, and its potential risks to human and animal health based on the best available science. He has frequently been interviewed on the subject in the local and national press, and has appeared on BBC Look North, Channel 4, ITV and Radio Europe. He also researches and writes about the subject on his website, www.isfrackingsafe.com.

Rt Revd Graham Cray, Honorary Assistant Bishop, Diocese of York

Graham lives in Kirby Misperton, the site of a proposed fracking well-site in Ryedale, and has travelled to Pennsylvania in the US where he met people from communities whose lives and businesses have been severely affected by fracking. He will be sharing their stories and slideshow presentations. Graham will be speaking in a personal capacity, not on behalf of the Diocese of York.
